Dear Mrs / Mr. MEP -----

Effective January of this year the prime minister of Spain is acting president of Europe. With great joy I listened to his inaugural speech in the Parliament from Mr. Zapatero and with even greater joy I listened to the response of the member of the house by Mrs. M. Andreassen who after the completion of the noble objectives, to return to reality, asked him about the Auken-Report and resolution of the parliament dated 26.3.2010 in his country. I was also very happy about the open letter that MEP Mr. M. Cashman wrote to Mr, Zapatero about the same subject in January 2010.

Automatically I wondered why no elected German member of the house spoke of the subject, despite the fact that tens of thousands of Germans are affected, and many hundreds of thousands affected Europeans throughout Spain, by the Ley de Costas the Spanish coastal law-

We as voters are asking ourselves how is it possible, that all sanctions of the Auken report did not find a majority in the Plenum, as last happened in October 2009.

We the voters ask further to what extent our members of parliament are aware that by signing the Lisbon Treaty, Spain has signed a new set of Laws, which apply to Spain too!!.

With the clear language of the paragraph 17 the Lisbon treaty is not compatible with the present Spanish Constitution.

We fear that Spain will try again, as before, to get an exemption, this time against 26 members of the European Union which is not acceptable for obvious reasons.

Dear Members of Parliament, in spite of the Auken-Report and the threatened sanctions, Spain has done nothing, it has just continued with the quasi expropriations of property, legally acquired, by many European citizens it now uses this law to seize river areas, lagoons and complete urbanizations like Santa Margarita, Roses, Catalonia and Empuriabrava that in part lie far inland, all under the pretext of protecting the environment and the welfare of the public for pure commercial objectives of individuals, or groups.

The consequence of this action usually is as in the case of Santa Margarita an additional burden on the environment and nature and not a reduction.

Dear Members, we urge you to support us by contacting your colleagues to support the sanctions imposed by the Auken report and to prevent an exemption under the Paragraph 17 of the Lisbon treaty for Spain and to follow closely the recent and ongoing activities of the Petitions Committee.
